Thank you for taking time to read my letter. I hope you find it thought provoking and I look forward for hearing your response.

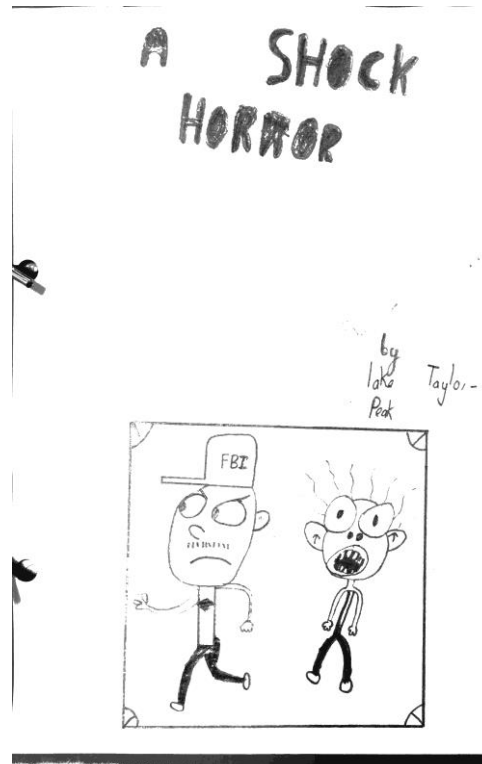
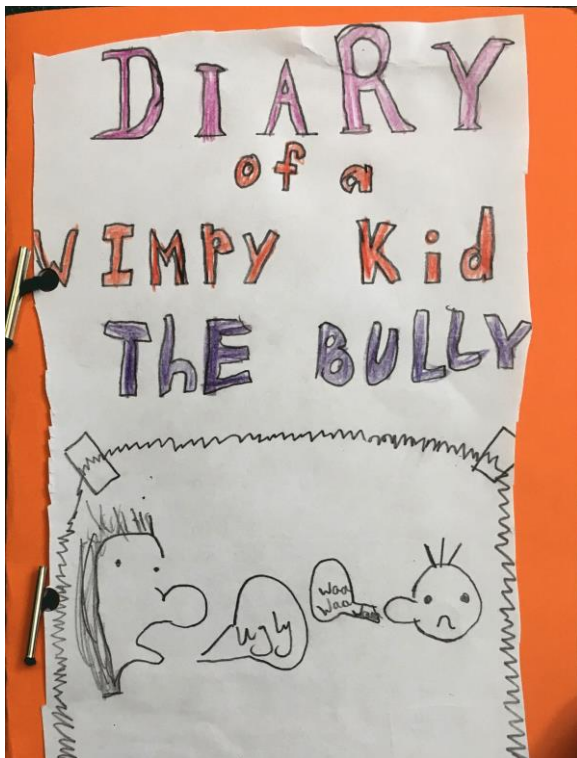
